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- **What is HARP about?**

- HARP stands for Heating Appliances Retrofit Planning, under Horizon 2020.

- **What is the project goal?**

- **Raise awareness** amongst consumers and motivate them to **replace** their inefficient heating appliances;
- **Output: online tool** providing an indication on the labelling classification (**ie efficiency**) of installed heating system, provide info on more efficient alternatives.

- **Who is part of the project?**

- 18 partners; led by PT energy agency. 5 EU Member States: Portugal, Spain, France, Italy, Germany. Energy agencies, consumers/NGO, national industry associations.

WHY IS THIS IMPORTANT?

Heating and hot water represents 80% of the energy demand of EU households

60% of the heating stock consists of inefficient boilers (class C or lower)

Consumers are not informed about the efficiency of their installed heating systems
